

The Solitariness of God

To understand God's highest holiness we must first recognize that God is **solitary** in His Excellency.

Scripture used:	Context:
Exodus 15:11	There is no other like God.
Genesis 1:1	In the beginning; God was alone in the unity of His nature.
Malachi 3:6	Even in the creation of man; God does not change. Therefore, His essential glory is not enhanced or diminished by anything created.
Ephesians 1:11	God consults with no one!
Nehemiah 9:5	God is above all blessing and praise.
Ephesians 1:5	God predestines you, based on His will.
Romans 11: 34-35	No one has given to Him first.
Job 35:7-8	What does God receive from you?
Luke 17:10	Our obedience has profited God nothing.
Psalms 16:2-3 Mark 14:61	Our Lord and Savior added nothing to His essential being and glory, either by what He did or suffered. The Psalm is about Christ. Christ's goodness and righteousness reached unto His saints in the earth, but God was high above and beyond it all, God only is "the Blessed One." (Mark 14:61 Greek)
Isaiah 40:15-18 Acts 17:23 Isaiah 40:22-23	To God we are as nothing before Him. "... We are regarded by Him as less than nothing and meaningless." Act 17:23 because of this He is the unknown God.
1 Timothy 6:16	God is the only immortal and is in control for all eternity.
Job 26: 14	Many apologists desire to bring down the thoughts of God to the finite mind of man, and have lost sight of His solitary excellence.
John 4:24	God can only be known spiritually.
John 3:3	Unless there is a second genesis you can't see the kingdom of God.
1 Corinthians 2:14	Man in his natural condition can't understand God, because they are spiritually appraised.
2 Corinthians 4:6	God supernaturally brings light into darkness through the Holy Spirit. This light shines in our hearts (not intellect) the light is the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ.
2 Peter 3:18	The regenerate soul must grow in God's Grace and the knowledge of Jesus Christ.

The principle prayer and aim of Christians should be: **Colossians 1:10**

"... So that you walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, to please Him in all respects, bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God."
