- 1. Men imagine that God is moved by sentiment, rather than actuated by principle. They suppose that His omnipotence is idle fiction and that Satan is thwarting His designs. Men think that if God has formed any plan or purpose at all, that these plans must be as theirs, constantly subject to change.
- 2. There is no alternative between an absolutely supreme God, and no God at all.
